ANALYSIS OF NORTH KIVU HUMAN RIGHTS AND DEVELOPMENT GROUPS ON THE UN FRAMEWORK AGREEMENT FOR PEACE, SECURITY AND COOPERATION FOR THE DEMOCRATIC REPUBLIC OF CONGO THE REGION SIGNED IN ADDIS-ABABA 24 February 2013

27, 2013 Gathered at its headquarters in Goma on Wednesday, February under the National Forum of Humanitarian and Development Defenders "FONAHD DRC", Human Rights Organizations, or have reviewed the Framework Agreement for Peace, Security and cooperation for the DR Congo and the Region signed in Addis-Ababa on 24 February 2013. The North Kivu Human Rights groups welcome the advent of the agreement and thank the signatories for the initiated for the process SO of establishment general sustainable eastern DRC and the and peace in African Great Lakes Region.

After careful review Framework Agreement, North Kivu а of the the Human Rights groups had the following observations: that signatories to the Framework Agreement have singled out failure of the DRC President's ruling power to establish dood governance, reform of vital areas of the Congolese nation such security as services, and non-compliance with the country's Constitution in regard decentralization process, the root the crisis that to the as cause of is tearing apart the eastern part of the country;

the establishment of the executioner status the DR Congo to yet of interference victim outside for more than two decades from its neighbors i.e. Rwanda and Uganda (ref. interim report of the UN Group of Experts of 21 June 2012 and its final report of 12 October 2012). The North Kivu Human Rights groups have also lamented M23 infighting activities Rutshuru and of other armed groups Masisi/North Kivu in in and elsewhere in the haut-plateau of Minembwe and in Uvira/South Kivu only a few hours the fact that after the signing of the Framework Agreement on Sunday, February 24, 2013 in Addis Ababa, thus triggering generalized psychosis and death of civilian populations. а

Moreover, North Kivu Human Rights groups noted that the fratricidal and bloody infighting within the March 23 movement (M23) since Sunday, February 24, 2013 in the center of the town of Rutshuru, simply evidences the negative and perverse character of that movement that disband should simply and its leaders brought to justice. In conclusion above, we, and in light of facts activists of the North Human Kivu Rights groups call the responsibility, patriotism and DRC Head of Pan-Africanism of the State to live up this time to his he signature SO as doesn't leave the country open to balkanization; We eleven Heads of State of the International ask the Conference on the Great Lakes Region, to play a fair game by stopping all support to negative forces such as M23 and other armed groups who are good for sowing death and destruction nothing else except among the peaceful plundering natural eastern Congolese citizens and the resources of DR Congo. May this Framework Agreement be this time implemented without hypocrisy!

Finally, activists of North Kivu Human Rights groups require that the sub-regional and national Civil Society granted be privileged а of position to share in the monitoring mechanisms the Framework Aareement to make it credible and assure actual desiderata that of communities ravaged by the cycle of violence in the Great Lakes Region are taken into account.
